Dear Parents/Carers,

As I am sure you are aware, the government have told primary schools to prepare for reopening on 1st June for Reception, Year 1 and Year 6. We will also continue our provision for our key worker children. You are receiving this letter because your child is in a year group which has not yet been invited to return. During the past 7 weeks, teachers and teaching assistants have been able to provide a high level of support by running Teams interventions, recording stories and planning detailed work. As I am sure you can appreciate, when schools begin to reopen on 1st June, our staff will be required to work with those children in school during the school day. Where possible, some interventions will continue, however these will be more limited. Teachers will continue to plan and prepare the weekly grids for children to work through, record stories and add worksheets to the website parent pages alongside setting work on Mathletics and Purple Mash. We would be really pleased if you could continue using Tapestry to show us what your child has been doing during their day, however, teachers may have to limit their comments or may take slightly longer to respond. Teachers will be unable to respond to emails when they are teaching.

Our key worker provision will continue in exactly the same way as previously but the children will arrive and leave through the Kestrels classroom door. If you are listed as a Key Worker and think you might need to access our care provision, please contact me to book a place. The number of children who can be accommodated is limited.

These are strange and difficult times and we appreciate your patience and support throughout this period. We understand that there will be a lot of anxiety for some children (and parents) over the next couple of months. If you or your child have any concerns or questions, please do not hesitate to contact their class teacher. We are a team and we will continue to support each other whether we are together or apart.
